Our school and PTA are working toward breaking ground on a new playground. The current playground is outdated and in need of improvement. Instead of putting bandaids on it and replacing old pieces we have decided to move forward on a brand new playground project. Our students, parents and community deserve a modern, safe and exciting place to exercise and have fun during recess and in off hours of school operation. The idea began in the 2014-2015 school year and our PTA started a go fund me page to begin raising money. Our school staff and PTA came together this summer to develop plans to more aggressively approach the idea of a new playground. A committee was formed and plans were developed to begin fund raising. We have surpassed our expectations and are now ready to break ground on phase one of our playground project. We not only want this to be a cornerstone playground for our school but also to serve the surrounding community helping with the current revitalization efforts of the great town of Nashville.

We have attached the pictures of the playground plan which includes three building phases. The following is a summary of how this project has come together and the funds raised thus far.

Lastly we have an idea we would like you to consider to help us achieve our goal in raising enough funds to begin with phase II and III of our playground project.

How it all started:

- PTA set up go fund me page raised about \$2000.00 during the 2014-15 school year.
- In July of 2015 new Principal Quintin Mangano meets with PTA President Shannon Williamson about the need for a new playground and the plans they had started last year.
- PTA playground committee is formed and begins planning fund raisers. Carrie Morningstar is chairperson of the committee and set up meetings with prospective playground vendors. Included were Shannon Davis, NRMP Maintenance Director, and Brian Hassell Project Manager of Town of Nashville to garner their input along with the PTA playground committee.

A brief summary of the fund raisers completed are listed below:

- Carolina Panthers tickets raffle raised \$10500.00.
- Our Fall Festival raised nearly \$5000.00.
- Traci Clark a parent and playground committee member and her daughter Regan a fifth grade student sent letters to many local businesses asking for donations and we have received nearly \$11000.00 from these and other local donations.
- We received a donation of \$12000.00 from an alumni Glen Batchelor.
- PTA has held several small fundraisers including Zaxby's and Parents night out.
- Funds raised since September total over \$47000.00.

Two Major fund raising plans for this year:

- Alumni Sock Hop at Nashville Elementary, March 19, 2016
- Nashville Elementary School 5K run September 10, 2016. We would like to partner with the Town on this event and ask for the support of our police and fire departments along with closing off roads impacted by the race course.

ORDINANCE 2016-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TEXT OF THE TOWN OF NASHVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 36, TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES PROVISIONS

WHEREAS, the Town of Nashville has an adopted Municipal Code containing regulations pertaining to traffic and vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Section 36, Article VI; authorizes that the accumulation of abandoned and derelict motor vehicles be eliminated and that the future abandonment of such vehicles be prevented; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of Nashville that the Town of Nashville Code of Ordinances be amended to reflect the following changes to Chapter 36, Traffic and Vehicles, Section 36-199 "General Penalty"

By Adding:

Section 36-199: "General Penalty"

If any person shall violate an ordinance of the town regulating the operation or parking of vehicles, the person shall be responsible for an infraction and shall be required to pay a civil penalty of not more than \$50. (G.S. 160A-175)
